For the second half of the evening, Yin presented a selection of his own photos discussing approach to each image and, in doing so, entertaining his audience with amusing anecdotes about his experiences in taking various "street photographs". Overall, a very accomplished performance throughout, by an articulate, personable and extremely talented photographer.

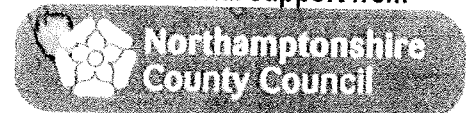

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Break-ins are happening all around us and these could be avoided by making a few simple checks.

Check windows and doors are locked when leaving premises. Your doors should be locked even when you are at home. Make sure valuables are out of sight. Secure outbuildings where garden machinery is kept and never leave keys close to the window or accessible through a letter box.

Modern cars are much more difficult to steal but there is an increase in theft of car keys to steal the family cars.

There will be a Crash Scene Management Course for motor cyclists on 5th June at Mereway Fire Station in Northampton from 10.0am until 1.0pm. It is designed to educate motor cyclists about road safety and how to stay safe on the road, also advice on what to do in a crash.

We have a chance in AYNHO to obtain the new Smartwater scheme for a reduced cost of £10.00 with no renewal fee. The commercial cost is about £58.00 plus an annual fee.
